The Oklahoma Safety Driver Program (OSDP) modernizes the role entirely—combining transportation, school safety, and crisis-readiness into a single, professional position that strengthens district stability statewide.

Key Components of OSDP:

- Full-time Bus Driver + Certified School Safety Officer combined into one professional role.
- Prioritizes recruitment of Oklahoma veterans, providing advanced crisis training and stable pay.
- Ensures reliable bus routes, reducing chronic shortages that disrupt daily school operations.
- Strengthens safety through trained personnel present on every bus and school grounds.
- Reduces turnover, liability exposure, and emergency consolidations caused by driver shortages.
- Improves attendance and keeps rural districts functioning by stabilizing transportation capacity.

Program Purpose

The OSDP is designed to professionalize transportation and school safety, giving districts a high-reliability workforce capable of handling transportation duties, safety monitoring, emergency response coordination, and student protection—all within a unified statewide framework.
